Lyrics Commands

These are to be used in the **Lyrics Editor**.

Symbol	Where do I place it?	What does it do?
/	Between lyrics	Chord change
// (no spaces)	Between lyrics	Skip one chord
!	Straight after a syllable	Stop self-formatting at this chord
^	On its own	Add an eighth note (no lyrics)
%	On its own	Add a quarter note (no lyrics)
*, ** or ***	On its own	Add a half, whole or double note (no lyrics)
&	Straight after a syllable	Add syllable text (no chords)
_ (underscore)	Before/ between/ after syllables	Adds a space in the lyrics

Rhythm Commands

These are to be used in the **Lyrics Editor**.

Symbol	Where do I place it?	What does it do?
<none> or %	Straight after a syllable	This syllable will be a quarter note
*	Straight after a syllable	This syllable will be a half note
** or ***	Straight after a syllable	This syllable will be a whole/ double note
^	Straight after a syllable	This syllable will be an eighth note
. (period)	Straight after any of the above	This syllable will be a dotted note.

Note Commands

These are to be used in the **Chants Editor**.

Every melodic line in every voice needs to be a list of notes separated by spaces, and each note consists of a **note letter**, an **accidental**, and an **octave number**.
Eg: E4 Ds4 E4

Symbol	Where do I place it?	What does it do?
A, B, C, D, E, F, G	At the start of a note	Indicates the note
d, b, n, <none>, s, x	Straight after the note letter	Gives the note an accidental: double flat, flat, natural, no accidental, sharp and double sharp , respectively.
1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6	Straight after the accidental symbol	Indicates the octave number
